



WEATHERBOARD CLADDING

Rather than rendering, weatherboard cladding has been utilised to add more tone and texture to the home. The selection of charcoal cladding challenges coastal design conventions, making the bold elevation as refreshing as a dip in the ocean.

San Selmo aged brick

The San Selmo Aged Bricks stand out by adding dimension and texture to the home. The tone is warm, yet still soft and natural in its setting. Incorporating the bricks into the landscaping ensures the experience doesn't simply finish at the façade, with the simple natural finishes bringing comfort to the outdoor space.







No beach house would be complete without the lush texture of natural material. Incorporating woods and woven materials into finishes connects the home to the outdoors. Timber flooring is a great way to embrace the natural beauty and imperfection of natural materials, bringing character to the home.

FEATURE TILING

Dark grey tiles have been utilised in the kitchen and bathroom to create an impact through a lovely contrast in the colour palette. The use of dark tiling gives the home a serene and tranquil setting, while still challenging the typical monochromatic greys seen so often in coastal homes.








NATURAL LIGHT

Natural light may be the single most important, yet most overlooked, element of coastal style. Adding light will create the feeling of more space in the home. The indulgent resort-style ensuite features skylights that draw the eyes immediately upwards, giving an even bigger sense of space. These skylights also enable you to lay in the free-standing bath and look up at the sky, creating a soothing, light-filled sanctuary.

RAKED CEILINGS

The art of space-optimising design requires the intelligent use of light and depth. Here on the upper living area, a beautifully airy ambience is achieved through the use of seamless white lining flowing into the raked ceiling. This gives the room an immense feeling of spaciousness as soon as you walk in.






INDOOR-OUTDOOR CONNECTIVITY

The Cabin has not one but two outdoor zones. Thanks to this unique layout, two sets of stacker doors extend the central entertaining area outside to a retreat-style alfresco and a courtyard with water feature that is perfect for early morning coffee.





WHITEWASHED WALLS

White walls are known to promote a sense of calmness, light and clarity in the home. Keep your walls neutral to create a clean base that will allow you to vary your shades and textures through other elements of the home such as woods, soft greys and blues. They also allow other features of the home to create an impact.




PICTURE FRAME WINDOW

The Cabin's striking elevation features the use of a large black steel-framed window. This feature adds an industrial element to the home while creating a cool contrast with the San Selmo bricks. In addition it provides a clean and sleek look alongside the weatherboard cladding while also adding some drama and style to the front elevation and internal upstairs sitting room.







COLOUR PALETTE

The use of soothing, natural colours creates the mood of a coastal home. Whites, creams and beiges are a must as they spread natural light and work beautifully with other ocean-inspired tones. The injection of darker colours, such as the Colorbond Monument cladding to the exterior of the home and the charcoal kitchen splashback, are both vibrant and reminiscent of oceans scenes.
